CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

THEME: ‘Media and Liberal Arts for Sustainable Development’

The Editorial Committee of the Annual International Research Symposium 2024 of the Sri Palee Campus, University of Colombo invites you to submit abstracts to be considered for presentation at the Technical Sessions of the Annual International Research Symposium on 20th November 2024. The abstracts should be based on original research work and, if accepted, should be presented at the Research Symposium. All accepted abstracts will be published in the Proceedings of the Annual Research Symposium 2024, University of Colombo.

* All other abstracts other than the Sri Palee campus academics will be published in the Proceedings of the AIRS 2024.

Common Conditions and Guidelines for Abstracts of the AIRS-2024:

1. Abstract: not exceeding 300 words and should be submitted according to the template.
2. The author’s declaration form should be signed and submitted along with the abstract submission.

Guidelines for the preparation of abstracts are attached. Please follow the instructions carefully. Please note that abstracts that are not prepared according to the guidelines provided or are submitted after the deadline, will not be considered for review. The Editorial Committee reserves the right to make alterations to the text of the abstract in order to improve its quality.

Guidelines for Submission of Abstracts

- i. The abstract must report original research not previously published elsewhere.
- ii. An author may submit a maximum of one abstract as a single author and up to three abstracts as a co-author. No author shall submit more than four abstracts in total.
- iii. The author(s)' names and addresses
 - a. Capital letters should be used only for the initials and the first letters of the surnames of authors.
 - b. The address of the Institution where the work was carried out should be included under the author's name.
 - c. If the collaborators are from different Institutions, the addresses of the Institutions should be included in brief. In this case, the addresses of the co-authors should be indicated by a number in superscript after the authors' names and before the respective addresses as shown below.

- i. The title should be brief and reflect the study reported. Capital letters should be used only for the first letter in the first word of the title and proper nouns.
- ii. The text of the abstract should not exceed 300 words excluding title, author affiliations, acknowledgements, and key words. The abstract must be structured into Introduction, Objectives, Methods, Results, and Conclusions.
- iii. Acknowledgements should be restricted to the names of funding agencies providing sponsorship.
- iv. Standard abbreviations of SI units should be used.
- v. A maximum of five keywords should be provided.
- vi. The abstract should be coherent and free of language errors.
- vii. Before you submit your abstract, ensure that the entire contents of the final abstract will fit into a single A4 page with 1 inch margins all around, font Times New Roman, size 11, and 1.5 spacing.
- viii. Two copies of the abstract should be submitted electronically as separate pages within a single word document. The first copy should contain name(s) of author(s) and institutional affiliations. The second copy should carry only the title and the text and **should not** contain name(s) of author(s) and place(s) where the research has been carried out.

Please note:

- i. The annexed declaration form must be signed, scanned, and returned by the corresponding author via email along with each abstract submitted.
- ii. All correspondence will be addressed to the corresponding author. If the corresponding author is a student, it is mandatory that the declaration form should be signed by the supervising author/s.
- iii. If the abstract is submitted by an undergraduate/postgraduate student, it should be collaborative with the supervisor.
- iv. The Editorial Committee has the right to reject abstracts that do not conform to these requirements.
