ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

Guidelines for Submission of Abstracts:

- I. The abstract should be based on the original research and not previously published or presented elsewhere.
- II. An author may submit a maximum of one abstract as a single author and up to three abstracts as a co-author/s. No author shall submit more than four abstracts in total.
- III. The author(s)' names and addresses
 - a. Capital letters should be used only for the initials and the first letters of the surnames of authors.
 - b. The address of the Institution where the work was carried out should be included under the author's name.
 - c. If the collaborators are from different Institutions, the addresses of the Institutions should be included in brief. In this case, the addresses of the coauthors should be indicated by a number in superscript after the authors' names and before the respective addresses, as shown below.

Example: (Multiple authors):

P. Gamage¹, D. M. Kulatunga²

1 Department of Chemistry, Faculty of Science, University of Colombo, Sri Lanka

- 2 Department of Public Health, Faculty of Medicine, University of Kelaniya, Sri Lanka
- IV. If a student is the corresponding author of a paper, their supervisor must be included as a co-author.
- V. The title should be brief and reflect the study reported. Capital letters should be used only for the first letter in the first word of the title and proper nouns.
- VI. The text of the abstract should not exceed 350 words, <u>excluding</u> title, author affiliations, acknowledgements, and keywords.
- VII. Acknowledgements should be restricted to the names of funding agencies providing sponsorship.
- VIII. Standard abbreviations of SI units should be used.
- IX. A maximum of five keywords should be provided.



- X. The abstract should be coherent and free of language errors.
- XI. Before you submit your abstract, ensure that the entire contents of the final abstract will fit into a single A4 page with 1-inch margins all round.
- XII. Font Times New Roman, font size 11, and 1.5 spacing, main topic font size 12.
- XIII. Please ensure that your abstract is written, adheres to APA Style guidelines, including proper formatting, grammar, and citation of sources.
- XIV. Two copies of the abstract should be submitted electronically as separate pages within a single Word document. The first copy should contain the name(s) of the author(s) and institutional affiliations. The second copy should carry only the title and the text and **should not** contain the name(s) of the author(s) and place(s) where the research has been carried out. Submissions must be provided in both MS Word and PDF formats.

Abstract

[An abstract comprises a concise, single-paragraph summary without subheadings, indentation, or references. Its primary objective is to effectively summarize the core of your presentation by clearly describing the problem addressed, the objectives of the research, the methodologies employed, and the major findings and conclusions drawn. This text should be formatted with 1.5 line spacing in 12-point Times New Roman font, and it must exclude the use of bullet points and, list of references. The initial section of the abstract should declare the specific problem or issue that your research seeks to address, along with a rationale to pursue the research. The abstract should explain the research methodologies applied in your research. Subsequently, it should present the results or findings derived from your research. The concluding remarks of your abstract should formulate the significance of the research and its contributions to the relevant academic discipline.

Keywords: (maximum of 5 words, separated by commas)



Please note:

- I. The annexed declaration form must be signed, scanned, and returned by the Corresponding Author via email along with each abstract submitted.
- II. All correspondence will be addressed to the corresponding author. If the corresponding author is a student, it is mandatory that the declaration form be signed by the supervising author/s.
- III. If the presenter indicated in the application is unable to present the paper, it is the responsibility of the Corresponding Author either to withdraw the paper in advance or arrange for one of the Co-Authors to present the paper.
- IV. The Editorial Committee has the right to reject the abstracts/research papers not conform to these requirements.
- V. Please note that abstracts not prepared according to the guidelines provided or submitted after the deadline will not be considered for review. The Editorial Committee reserves the right to make alterations to the text of the abstract to improve its quality.

Abstract Review

The abstracts will undergo a blind peer review process, and authors will receive notifications regarding the acceptance of their presentations via email. Author/s should revise the abstract based on the comments of reviewers and submit it before the stipulated deadline.
